

IQAC INITIATIVES



A Three-Day Faculty Enrichment Programme was organized by IQAC from 01.08.2024 to 03.08.2024 in hybrid mode. The distinguished Resource Person for the FEP was Dr Ajay Semalty, Assistant Professor, Department of Pharmaceutical Science, University SWAYAM Coordinator (SPOC: NPTEL), Hemvati Nandan Bahuguna Garhwal University. He delivered his valuable lecture on various aspects of the topic 'Content Creation and Development under SWAYAM-MOOCS'. On day one of the Programme, Dr. Semalty laid emphasis on the need of MOOCs (Massive Open Online Course). In his lecture, he gave an introduction of OERs (Open Educational Resource) and also spoke about the types of licenses and copyright rules and regulations. He also laid stress on the need of creating an open educational repository and the ways in which digital content should be shared with the students. The informative session was attended by 56 faculty members. The topic for the second day was 'Chalking Out an Effective MOOC Proposal'. He described the steps of planning, content writing, designing & uploading, sharing and presentation. The session was attended by 53 faculty members. The topic for 3rd day lecture was 'Creating E- content and Interactive E-Resources for ICT Based Eco System Development". He gave valuable suggestions for ways and means of overcoming gaps and limitations in content creation. The final session was attended by 61 faculty members.

An Orientation Programme on 'Financial Literacy' was organized for the non-teaching staff on 3.8.2024. The Resource Persons were Mrs. Divya Sinha, Branch Manager, PNB, Nirmala College and Sangeeta Kumari, employee of the same bank. They explained the benefits of various types of savings and insurance schemes that were being offered to the staff of the college as customers of the bank. The session was



attended by 41 non-teaching staff.

IQAC in collaboration with the Inner Wheel Club of Ranchi South organized an 'Awareness Programme on Cyber Crime' and 'Talk & Demo on CPR on 22.08.2024. The speakers for 'Awareness Programme on Cyber Crime' were two advocates, Ms Shiwangi Sinha and Ms Shalini. They enlightened the audience on different methods of Cyber Crime. They also gave useful suggestions to protect ourselves from scheming fraudsters. Another immensely beneficial demonstration on CPR (Cardio-Pulmonary Resuscitation) was given by critical care expert Dr Sana Anjum Haque. She explained the life- saving technique used to revive individuals experiencing cardiac arrest or respiratory failure. The audience benefitted by learning through demonstration of CPR on a dummy. 35 faculty members and 129 students of UG semester 2 and PG semester 2 attended the Programme.

A Two-Day sensitization programme was conducted on the topic 'Holistic and Multidisciplinary Education' on 10th and 11th September 2024 for the students of first batch of FYUGP,



session 2022-26. Eminent Resource Person Dr. Debjani Roy, Head, PG Department of Geography, Nirmala College and member, IQAC Nirmala College, deliberated on the meaning and need for Holistic Education as per requirement of New Education Policy 2020. Citing real life examples as well as the rich legacy of our education system, the students were initiated into accepting and acknowledging the usefulness of Holistic Education.

A Two-Day Orientation Programme was held for the teaching and non-teaching faculty from 3.1.2025 to 4.1.2025. On 3rd January, the eminent Resource Person, Advocate Shivangi Sinha, spoke at length on the topic, 'Cyber Crime-Preventive Measures'. It was attended by 60 faculty members and 27 non-teaching staff. The objective of the programme was to create awareness about the increasing cyber-crimes and ways to prevent it. On 4th January, the illustrious Resource Person, Dr Swati Lal, deliberated on the topic 'Health and Wellness'. She spoke on various aspects of health and wellness focusing specially on issues for women of different ages. The participants received information on new vaccines and practices to prevent diseases such as cervical cancer, PCOD, osteoporosis etc. It was attended by 62 faculty members and 33 non-teaching staff.



An Orientation Programme for the Non-Teaching Staff was organized on the topic 'Updates and Documentation' on 4.1.2025. The esteemed Resource Persons were from Nirmala College - Dr Sr Shobha, Vice Principal and IQAC Member and Mr Santosh Dang (Administrative office). It was attended by 33 non- teaching staff and the entire IQAC team. Dr Sr Shobha deliberated on the importance and objectives of ABC (Academic Bank of Credit) ID. Mr. Santosh, the second Resource Person, explained the various aspects of APAAR (Automated Permanent Academic Account Registry).

Objectives and benefits of ABC ID and APAAR and their importance under NEP 2020 were discussed at length.



IQAC and the Department of Zoology in association with Axon Health Care, Ranchi, organized a Health Camp on Bone Mineral Density on 11.01.2025. Well known neurosurgeon Dr Anil Kumar, Dr Viraat



Harsh and Dr Madhumita Lal Banker shared immensely valuable information on bone-related problems, their remedies and preventive measures. Dr Lal advised the audience that women must include calcium in their diet especially after 30 years of age to prevent osteoporosis to reduce the risk of bone fracture. Dr Viraat emphasized the importance of vitamin D in calcium absorption. Free bone density test was conducted for teaching and non-teaching staff as well as students followed by individual medical advice by Dr Lal. The health camp was immensely beneficial in creating awareness regarding bone related issues in women. It was attended by 35 teaching staff, 17 non-teaching staff and 42 students.

An Orientation programme on the topic 'Yoga and Wellness' was organized for the teaching and non-teaching staff on 21.06.2025. The eminent Resource Person, Dr Madhulika Verma, Associate Professor, PG Department of Sanskrit, RU,

Ranchi and Ex-Director, School of Yoga, RU, gave an informative lecture on various aspects of yoga that have been in practice in India since ancient times. She also pointed out that study of yogic science has gained importance and its students find jobs easily after graduation. The programme was attended by 80





teaching and 36 non-teaching staff.

A 5-day Faculty Enrichment Programme was organized by IOAC on 'Transformative Teaching: Adapting NEP 2020 in Higher Education' from 23.06.2025 to 28.06.2025. On the first two days, 23rd and 24th June, Dr. Neeraj Kumar, Assistant Professor, PG Department of Chemistry, Ranchi University, Ranchi, Member, NEP Implementation and Monitoring Committee and Member, State level NEP Implementation Cell, DHTE, Jharkhand, delivered a lecture on the topic 'Effective Implementation of NEP for FYUGP from 2025 Onwards'. In his address he highlighted the inclusion of human aspect in NEP and how communication plays a very important role. He also laid emphasis on the importance of application of knowledge. He discussed the National Skills Qualification Framework (NSQF) as well as the National Higher Education Qualification Framework (NHEQF) and the changes that have been made. He also discussed the courses and credits in detail and explained the Multiple Entry and Multiple Exit transfer system for students in college and universities. 48 faculty members attended on day one while 51 were present on day two of the programme. On 25th June, the third day, the learned speaker, Dr Raj Kumar Sharma, Associate Professor and Principal, Doranda College, Ranchi, shared his expertise on 'Indian Knowledge System' and familiarized the participants with the importance, needs and perspectives of syllabus designing. He emphasized the role of language in the development of human civilization and how Indian philosophy has permeated every other civilization. 52 faculty members participated in the programme. On the 4th day of the 5-Day FEP, Professor Anant Kumar, HOD, Rural Management at XISS, Ranchi, deliberated on 'Fostering Student Diversity and Inclusivity in Higher Education'. He explored the dimensions of student diversity, examined the



challenges and opportunities of fostering Inclusivity, suggested practical strategies for inclusive education and teaching and discussed the transformative power of inclusive education. 50 faculty members were present. On the final day, 28th June 2025, Dr P Bhawna, Senior Scientist, ICAR, Plandu, Ranchi deliberated on 'Entrepreneurial Skills in HEIs'. She shared her ideas on the role of entrepreneurs, the skills needed, the risks that were taken, and the challenges that entrepreneurs faced. Day five was attended by 51 faculty members. The five days were immensely informative and engaging and the participants gained a lot from the sessions.

All the programmes and events were organized under the leadership and guidance of Dr. Sr. Jyoti, Chairperson IQAC and Principal, Nirmala College, Ranchi and coordinated by Dr. Jyoti Prasad, Coordinator, IQAC and HOD, Psychology.

Short Term Course in Basic Computer Skills

Thirty-Seven students of the ninth batch successfully completed the 90 days' short-term course, DCA (Diploma in Computer Application) organized by the IQAC of Nirmala College in association with NSL Comp, Jharkhand. CAPACITY BUILDING INITIATIVES

National Seminar

A two-day National Seminar was organized by Dept. of Zoology, Nirmala College Ranchi on the topic "Climate Resilience and India: With Special Reference to Jharkhand" on 1st and 2nd March 2025 sponsored by Jharkhand Council for Science Technology and Innovation (JCSTI), Dept. of Higher and Technical Education, Jharkhand. The inaugural session was presided over by Chief Secretary, Dept. of Forest Environment and Climate Change, Abu Bakar Siddiqui, Registrar RU, Dr. G.C Sahu and Registrar Rai University, Dr. Piyush Ranjan, Principal Nirmala College Dr. Sr. Jyoti, and Convener of the National Seminar cum HOD Zoology, Dr. Emma. R. Seraphim. The Seminar included keynote lectures by eminent academicians, invited guest lectures as well as oral presentation by delegates from different parts of the country. The main attraction of the Seminar was the category of student's presentation where students from the college and outside college were given an opportunity to present their topic in the form of power point presentation on the focal

theme of the climate change and resilience.

A total of 112 research papers were presented in the two days of the Seminar. Keynote speakers included Dr. P.K Joshi (Professor, JNU) and Dr. Rajeev Pandey (ICFRE, Dehradun) on the 1st day of the Seminar. Dr. Deshraj Thakur from Himachal Pradesh University and Dr. Abhishek Anand from IMD, Ranchi shared their views on Climate issues and its resilience on the 2nd day of the Seminar.

Delegates and student participants of the Seminar were also presented with certificates in the valedictory session. Dr. Vibha Pandey Deputy, Director Higher Education also graced the occasion with her presence. She appreciated the endeavor of the Institution and appealed to the faculty and students to come up with more such ideas that can culminate into policy and guidelines for managing climatic resilience. Dr. Indu Kumari (Botany), Dr. Anjali Smita (Zoology), Dr. Afreen Khan (English) and Dr. Jyoti Pandey (Economics) were organizing secretaries for the Seminar. Dr. Veenapani, Dr. Manisha Kumari and Sr. Suman were treasurers for the two-day National Seminar.







Capacity Building initiatives for students: Workshop

A 3-day workshop on Application of Economics in Real World was organised on 23rd-25th August 2024. The resource person of the event was Mr. Indal Kumar, former Asstt. Prof, Sarla Birla University Ranchi and Research Scholar at JNU, New Delhi. The idea behind the workshop was to expose the students towards in-depth understanding and practical application of economic theory in research that could be helpful in designing project work to be undertaken in FYUGP curriculum as a compulsory paper. Total 113 students from Dept. of Economics participated in the event.

Special Lecture

A special lecture-cum-student's talk was conducted under the Lecture Series activity of Dept. of Economics on 31st January 2025. The theme for the student talk was "Let's learn and grow

together". Ms. Amairaa Chakraborty, a talented and diligent student of Bachelor of Economics from University of Queensland, Australia was the resource person for the lecture programme. She introduced the teaching learning environment of a foreign university and interacted with fellow students of Nirmala College, thereby addressing their queries related to studies being undertaken abroad. Students also got to know about the kinds of research projects which have real time application that could be taken up by the students of economics. It was a wonderful opportunity for the students as they got a glimpse and idea of the teaching-learning goals, curriculum and career prospects in a foreign University.73 students from both UG and PG participated in the knowledge sharing programme.

Participation in off-campus events Stakeholder Workshop IMD

A one-day stakeholder workshop on Severe Weather and Meteorological Services over Jharkhand was held on 16th December 2024 at Project Bhawan, Dhurwa, Ranchi by Indian Meteorological Department (IMD) to celebrate its momentous occasion of 150 years of service to the nation in public weather services. The workshop was an opportunity for collaboration, discussion, and engagement with key stakeholders to further enhance weather services and address present and future needs. Honorable Governor of Jharkhand Sri Santosh Gangwar was the chief guest on the occasion. Three faculty members Dr. Emma. R Seraphim (HOD,





Zoology), Dr. Manisha Kumari (Zoology) and Dr. Perween Zahra (Geography) participated with 11 students from Dept. of Zoology and Geography respectively. The workshop emphasized on environmental mocks in the areas of weather forecast, climate monitoring, disaster management, research and awareness as well as sustainable development.

Outreach Activity (NIFT)

National Institute of Fashion Technology established under Ministry of Textiles, Govt. of India organized an Outreach Programme at Radisson Blu, Ranchi on 18th November 2024



for encouraging students to consider NIFT courses as a career option after a Bachelor Degree. Vice Principal Dr. Sr. Shobha and HOD Zoology Dr. Emma R Seraphim participated in the programme with two students from Dept. of Zoology namely, Malcha Tokas (SEM I) and Anamika Kumari (SEM II). The objective of the workshop was to raise awareness about NIFT's programmes, scholarships, and admission process mainly for ST/SC/Backward Class/Wards of artisan's students, offering them an opportunity to pursue careers in fashion and design.

MoUs, COLLABORATIONS AND RESEARCH PROJECTS

XBHEI MoU Activities

Nirmala College Ranchi has signed a number of MoUs with various Xavier Board Higher Educational Institutions across the nation in an effort to foster an environment for learning and imparting quality education to our students. In this academic year Botany Department of St. Joseph's College, Kerela had collaborated with the Botany, English, Fashion Designing and Commerce department of Nirmala College to organize a Poster Making Competition on 27th August, 2024 via hybrid mode. The theme for the competition was *Innovations in Technology for a Greener Future*. The objective of the competition was to provide a platform to the






students to express their creativity, artistic skills and ideas visually. The event showcased the talents, creativity and thinking ability of the 23 participants.

A Multi-Disciplinary Seminar on 'The Role of Chemical Weapons in Contemporary Geopolitics' was organised on 28th October, 2024 by Chemistry and Political Science Departments of Little Flower Degree College, Uppal, Hyderabad in collaboration with the Departments of Chemistry and Political Science, Nirmala College Ranchi. The seminar aimed at exploring the intersection of science, technology and international politics in understanding the use and impact of chemical weapons. Students gained insight into the scientific principles behind chemical weapons and their geopolitical implications. The seminar also enabled the young





minds to develop critical thinking to evaluate global policy frameworks. The seminar held in hybrid mode witnessed the participation of 141 students. The event was coordinated by Dr. Rashmimala Sahu (HOD, Political Science, Nirmala College), Dr. Sreerupa Roy (HOD, Chemistry, Nirmala College), Rama Devi (Coordinator, Chemistry Department, Little Flower Degree College), Ms. Thane Saviarappa (HOD, Political Science, Little Flower Degree College), and Mrs. V. Pannaga (IQAC Co- Coordinator, Little Flower Degree College).

A World Meteorological Day 2025 Digital Poster and Photography Contest was held by the Geography Department, Nirmala College Ranchi in collaboration with Loreto College, Kolkata. There were 15 entries in Digital Poster and 11 entries in Photography. The judges were Dr. Aritra Khettry, National Lead for Elephant Conservation, WWF, India and Mr. Sanjay Bose, Photographer and Faculty of Mass Communication (Ranchi University).

The results were declared on 23rd March on the occasion of World Meteorological Day 2025. The initiative taken jointly by both the Colleges was coordinated by Dr. Debjani Roy (HoD Geography, Nirmala College) and Dr. Sushma Sahay, (HoD Geography, Loreto College, Kolkata).

Lifetech Software

A Memorandum of Understanding has been signed on 8th March 2025 between Nirmala College, Ranchi and Lifetech Software, Ranchi to collaborate in offering a Short-Term Course in CHN Computer Hardware and Networking for BCA students. Seven Day Training Programme on Mushroom Spawn Production

A 7-day training programme on Mushroom Spawn Production was conducted in Nirmala College from 20th November to 27th November, 2024. A total of 14 students from the departments of Botany, Chemistry and Zoology participated in the programme.

Jharkhand Grassroot Innovation Internship Scheme

The Jharkhand Grassroot Innovation Scheme (JGIIS) is a pilot project for the college students sponsored by Jharkhand Council on Science, Technology and innovation (JCSIT), Government of Jharkhand. It aims at providing opportunities to students to work in villages thus connecting academia to

MoE NMEICT Initiatives: Value-added Short-term Certification Programmes



Spoken Tutorial Programme

The Spoken Tutorial Programme, an initiative under the National Mission on Education through ICT, Ministry of Education, Government of India, aims at advancing IT literacy through open-source software. This year, 353 students from the Departments of BCA, BBA, and Fashion Designing benefited from the programme, engaging in a diverse array of

courses including Python, Web Development, C, C++, LibreOffice Writer, LibreOffice Calc, LibreOffice Draw, and Introduction to Computers. These courses not only enriched their technical expertise but also complemented their academic curriculum, preparing them for the demands of a technology-driven world. The self-paced format encouraged students to take ownership of their learning, enabling them to master the tools independently and gain the confidence to apply their skills effectively. The initiative was successfully coordinated by Dr. Sonali Sinha, Head of the Department of Computer Applications.

SWAYAM-NPTEL MOOCs

Nirmala College, a recognised Local Chapter of SWAYAM-NPTEL Massive Open Online Courses (MOOCs), continues to actively support the Government of India's digital learning initiative. Through its e-library, the college facilitates enrolment and provides seamless access to a wide range of courses, along with dedicated mentorship for enrolled learners. During the July-October 2024 session, 91 students registered for 53 courses, while four faculty members participated in eight faculty development programmes. Alplata Bakhla from the Department of Psychology excelled in the *Sports Psychology* MOOC, earning an *Elite* certification with a score of 69%. Among faculty participants, Dr. Rajni Singh, Assistant Professor in the Department of BBA, successfully

earned certifications in *E-Business* and *HR Analytics*, while Dr. Apeksha Prajapati, Assistant Professor in the Department of Mathematics, qualified the course *EXCELing with Mathematical Modelling*.

In the January–April 2024 session, 53 students enrolled in 40 courses, and three faculty members registered in three faculty development programmes. Out of 19 students who appeared for the proctored examinations, 17 qualified. Serena Toppo (FYUGP Zoology Major) successfully completed the Climate Change Science MOOC, while also earning "Elite + Silver" and "Elite" certifications in Microbial Biotechnology and Fundamentals of Ecology respectively. The Department of Chemistry achieved remarkable success during this term. In the 12-week Medicinal Chemistry MOOC, instructed by Prof. Harinath Chakrapani of IISER Pune, four Chemistry Major students qualified, with Mahima Kandulna and Nimriti Singh of FYUGP (2023-27) earning "Elite + Silver" badge with impressive scores of 82% and 75%, while Shilpa Khushi Soy and Vanshika Kumari of FYUGP (2024-28) received Elite certification. In the Industrial Inorganic Chemistry MOOC, taught by Prof. Debashis Ray of IIT Kharagpur, ten Chemistry Major students qualified, including six Elite achievers — Harshita Kumari, Deepshikha Kumari, Arti Kachhap, Deepti Topno, Jacinta Dungdung and Srishti Kerketta — while Manisha Ekka, Abha Kusum Kujur, Tannu Kumari and Anisha Xalxo also successfully completed the course. Dr. Sreerupa Roy, Head of the Department of Chemistry, served as Mentor for both Chemistry MOOCs.

All courses were conducted by NPTEL through the SWAYAM portal, with Dr. Apeksha Prajapati, Assistant Professor in the Department of Mathematics, serving as the

Single Point of Contact (SPOC) for the Nirmala College SWAYAM-NPTEL Local Chapter. Principal Dr. Sr. Jyoti congratulated all students and faculty members for their dedication, consistent effort and outstanding performance in these prestigious online learning programmes.

ENHANCING LEARNING THROUGH OTHER ICT INITIATIVES

ICT Initiatives at Nirmala College, Ranchi

Nirmala College, Ranchi, has consistently been at the forefront of integrating technology into education through a series of ICT-driven initiatives aimed at enhancing learning and making academic resources more accessible to students.

INFLIBNET-NLIST E-Resources: Through its annual INFLIBNET-NLIST membership, the College provides students and faculty with access to an extensive collection of e-journals, e-books, and research articles. This initiative significantly enriches academic engagement and strengthens research pursuits across disciplines.

E-Library and E-Book Repository: The Sr. Priscilla E-Library and Browsing Centre houses a comprehensive e-book repository, offering academic textbooks, reference works, and subject-specific resources. Equipped with LAN connectivity, the facility supports assignments, projects, and access to relevant e-resources, ensuring flexibility, convenience, and quality in learning.

Hybrid Learning Activities: Adopting a hybrid model, the College enables both in-person and online participation in academic and extracurricular events. This approach not only broadens student and faculty engagement but also fosters





collaborations with higher education institutions across the country and abroad.

Online and ICT-Enabled Classes: To ensure continuity of learning during public examinations or other occasions when regular offline sessions are not feasible, the College conducts online classes via user-friendly platforms and learning management systems. The integration of ICT tools—campus Wi-Fi, laptops, projectors, smartboards, and more—has enhanced teaching effectiveness. Cloud-based storage and collaborative documentation practices are also well established at the departmental level.

ICT Repository on Official YouTube Channel: Since 2020, the College's official YouTube channel (https://www.youtube.com/@nirmalacollegeranchi-offic3796) has

served as a rich repository of over 1,700 recorded lectures, tutorials, and educational videos for both UG and PG students, enabling them to revisit lessons and explore supplementary resources at their convenience.

WhatsApp as an Official Communication Tool: WhatsApp is used as an official instant messaging medium for students and staff, ensuring prompt communication of academic notices, events, and other important updates.

Under the able guidance of Principal Dr. Sr. Jyoti, these ICT initiatives have fostered an inclusive, accessible, and future-ready learning environment. In alignment with the principles of the NEP 2020, the College continues to empower students with essential digital competencies for success in the modern world.

EXTENSION AND OUTREACH



Scientific Outreach: Empowering Underprivileged Students through Hands-on Laboratory Experience: Department of Zoology, Nirmala College, Ranchi organized

an Extension Activity for the Outreach students of St. Xavier's School, Doranda, Ranchi on 28th April, 2025. A workshop was conducted on the topic of "Determination of ABO blood group" in order to make the students aware of the significance of being aware of one's own blood group and the method to determine it. Dr. Emma R Seraphim (HOD, Zoology) introduced the students to the relevance of the workshop. Dr. Manisha Kumari, Asstt Prof. Dept of Zoology demonstrated the technique of identification of blood groups which was followed by a hands-on- experience for every outreach student. The students prepared their own temporary slide and hence could determine their own blood groups after the demonstration. Mitotic cell division, which is an integral part of the cur-

riculum, was made clear to the students through slides under a microscope. Students of Semester III volunteered for the activity.
