#### COLLEGE WITH POTENTIAL FOR EXCELLENCE: PROGRESS REPORT

Nirmala College has been awarded the CPE status by UGC during the 12<sup>th</sup> plan for a period of five years (2016-2021). First installment of the funds received under this scheme will be utilized for procuring books for the college library, upgradation of the

laboratories & LAN-Wi-Fi system, automation of the library & offices, subscription to INFLIBNET-NLIST e-resources and installation of a new language laboratory. Detailed project planning & implementation is in progress.

#### **MHRD-RUSA UPDATES**



After being selected as one of the 30 colleges of Jharkhand in 2015, Nirmala College is receiving an Infrastructure grant under MHRD's Rashtriya Uchchtar Shiksha Abhiyan (RUSA).

The first installment of this grant has been utilized to procure books for the college library, sports kits, classroom furniture, computers, facilities like LAN/Wi-Fi, INFLIBNET & library automation and other important items for developing the infrastructure of the institution. The second installment is being utilized for the construction of new classrooms & conference hall, upgradation and renovation of the proposed sites in the existing academic building including the playground, auditorium, girls' WC, library & administrative offices. The institution's RUSA Committee had submitted the respective Utilization Certificates. Utilization of the grant is

also being constantly monitored by MHRD through the geo-tagged photographs & data uploaded by the institution on BHUVAN-RUSA & PFMS. The Jharkhand RUSA team comprising Dr. Nitish Raj, Dr. Sunit Kumar, Mr. Prasun Sengar and Ms. Jyoti Pushpa inspected the College on 17<sup>th</sup> November 2016. Satisfactory report was presented by the team after physical verification of all the procured items. VISAKA sensitization workshop was organized on 19<sup>th</sup> Dec 2016 to spread awareness among the students, teaching and non-teaching staff of the college regarding implementation of cashless transaction in the campus. 14 student volunteers were registered for the propagation of VISAKA. A sensitization workshop on PFMS was held on 24<sup>th</sup> Jan, 2017 for the members of RUSA and CPE committee. The resource person, Ms. Jyoti Pushpa (Finance Manager of RUSA, Jharkhand) explained the methodology to be adopted in managing the finances through PFMS portal.

#### **AUTOMATION OF COLLEGE LIBRARY & ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICES**

To bring accuracy and to improve the efficiency of library administration and management, Nirmala College is using the advanced technology of computers to automate the typical procedures of the college library such as acquisition, accessioning, classification, cataloguing, circulation, serial control, information storage and retrieval, indexing etc. through **Koha software**, a web-based open source Integrated Library System (ILS). In this regard, documents have been classified and arranged

accordingly. Barcode job is in progress. All documents have been incorporated into the Koha software and simultaneously, shelves rectification is going on. The College library also provides free access to more than 6,000 e-journals and 31,00,000 e-books under the UGC-INFLIBNET N-LIST programme. Automation of the administrative offices of the college is also under process. To ensure more transparency and efficiency, online admissions will be facilitated soon.

#### **BEST PRACTICES**

Nirmala College is committed to the task of enhancing the quality and performance of the teachers and students through the adoption and implementation of Best Practices.

#### **Faculty Enrichment Programs**

In order to enhance the teaching skills and performance of its faculty, the institution regularly organizes Faculty Enrichment Programs. Eminent personalities, scholars and academicians are invited to deliver talk and lectures on different topics that would enlighten the teachers and enable them to upgrade their skill. A Faculty Enrichment Program was organized in the college on 22<sup>nd</sup> June, 2016. Prof. Saraswati Mishra was invited as the Resource Person. She spoke on 'Faculty Development in Higher Educational Institutions'. Another Faculty Enrichment Program was organized on 3<sup>rd</sup> January, 2017. Mr. Kislaya Bhattacharya,

Management Trainer and former D G M, Academics, Indian Institute of Coal Management was invited as the Resource Person. He delivered his views on 'Enhancing Communication Skills in Higher Educational Institutions'. It is expected that such programs would enrich the teachers and enable them to meet the challenges of the competitive world.

#### **Career Awareness Programs**

The institution regularly organizes Career Awareness Programs to sensitize the students about various career opportunities. These Career Awareness Programs enable the students to explore their potential, skills, abilities and strengths and assist them to identify future careers. The objective of these Career Awareness Programs is to enhance the students' awareness and understanding of career opportunities and equip them with knowledge that would empower them to face the challenges in highly competitive job market.

#### **NSS ACTIVITIES**

As has been the scenario for many years, the NSS wing of Nirmala College had an activity filled year. With the wholehearted support of the Principal, Dr. Sr. Jyoti, Program Officers Dr. Sr. Sushma and Dr. Janet

World Human Rights Day was observed by a human chain of NSS students in the college premises on 10<sup>th</sup> December. In 2017, National Youth Day commemorated Swami Vivekananda's Birthday on 12<sup>th</sup> January with the garlanding of his portrait, and a talk on



On 20<sup>th</sup> March, student volunteers attended the seminar organized by JSACS (Jharkhand State AIDS Control Society) to empower HIV infected women. Traffic SP Sanjay Ranjan Singh shared traffic awareness rules with the students on 10<sup>th</sup> April, during Road Safety Awareness Programme. The biggest achievement for NSS Unit 1 of Nirmala College was the award of Second Best Unit in National Young Leader Award from the Government of India, Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports. The college received a memento, a certificate and Rs 30,000/- cash award.

#### **NATIONAL SEMINAR**

A two-day National Seminar on 'Women in Colonial and Post-Colonial India: With special reference to Jharkhand' was organized by the Department of History, Nirmala College on 19<sup>th</sup> and 20<sup>th</sup> December 2016, with Dr. Anjana Singh (HOD, Dept. History) as the convener. Chief Guest and Guest of Honour for the occasion were Hon'ble Vice chancellor, Ranchi University, Dr. Ramesh Pandey and Dean of Social Sciences, Ranchi University, Dr. I. K. Choudhary. Keynote speakers were Prof. Rekha Pandey, Joint faculty, Center for Women's Studies, School of Social Sciences, University of Hyderabad and Dr. Alpa Shah from Department of Anthropology, London School of Economics, UK. Principal, Dr. Sr. Jyoti welcomed and felicitated the dignitaries and Souvenir was released. Prof. Rekha Pandey discussed in



detail the plight and condition of women in pre-and postcolonial eras, whereas Dr. Alpa Shah highlighted the role and wonders of Adivasi Women and their gender issues in the history as well as in present scenario. There was a Panel discussion on "Reading Gender in Post Colonial Context: Global, National and Local Perspective". The Panel members were Prof. Rekha Pandey from University of Hyderabad, Dr. H. K Patel, Department of History, Rabindra Bharti University, Kolkata and Barkha Lakra, a social activist and journalist. Ms. Lakra is the recipient of "Vishnu Prabhakar Award" for her work related to highlighting the issues of Adivasi as well as marginalized tribal women. The moderator of the panel discussion was Dr. Swati Parashar, a Senior Lecturer in Politics and International Relations at School of Social Sciences, Monash University, Australia. The two-day seminar witnessed the presence of near about 113 participants and 103 presentations. The event marked the sharing of knowledge, ideas and efforts of national and international delegates. The Registrar, Ranchi University, Dr. Amar Kr Choudhary, in his concluding address, appreciated the efforts of the college to organize such a wonderful academic event.
