A three-membered NAAC Peer Team, comprising the Chairperson, Prof. Manimala Das (Former Vice Chancellor, Netaji Subhash Open University, Kolkata), Member Co-ordinator, Dr. F. Andrew (Principal, St. Joseph's College, Tiruchirappalli), and Member, Dr. Rohini Prasad (Vice Chancellor, Sarguja University, Raipur, Chhattisgarh) visited Nirmala College from 28th - 29th August 2017 for the second cycle of Re-accreditation. The Peer team members interacted with the Principal, members of the IQAC Steering Committee and stakeholders to authenticate the profile

of the institution. They also interacted with the Library management committee, Accounts office, Main office, parents, students, hostelers to validate and assess the quality of institutional functioning and facilities available to the students. MHRD-Rashtriya Uchhatar Shiksha Abhiyan (RUSA)





UGC-COLLEGE WITH POTENTIAL FOR EXCELLENCE

The college has been awarded the CPE status by UGC during the 12th plan for a period of five years (2016-2021). First instalment of the funds received under this scheme has been utilized for procuring books for the College Library, sports facilities (Netball), ICT devices and teaching aids, upgradation of the classrooms, existing laboratories, internet connectivity and internet services, automation of College Library, installation of a new GIS-Remote Sensing lab, facilitating sports coaching and in conducting Capacity Building National Workshop for the enrichment of teachers. Skill development programmes and installation of a new language laboratory is under planning.

UGC-CPE Sponsored Capacity Building National Workshop

A two- day Capacity Building National Workshop on "Writing Research Paper" funded by UGC-CPE Scheme was conducted on 9th and 10th December 2017.
