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CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM (CBCS) FOR UNDER GRADUATE COURSES UNDER RANCHI UNIVERSITY ACADEMIC SESSION 2022 - 2025

Definition

- **Academic Year:** Two consecutive (one odd+one even) semesters constitute one academic year.
- **Academic Calender:** An academic calender will be prepared by the university to maintain uniformity in CBCS of the UG Honours Programmes, semester and course in the college run under the University (Constituent/ Affiliated).
- **Semester:** An academic year comprising 180 working days in the least is divided into 2 semesters, each semester having at least 90 working days. With 6 working days in a week this would mean that each semester will have $90/6 = 15$ teaching/working weeks. Considering that each teaching day has 5 teaching/working hours, a teaching week would have $5 \times 6 = 30$ working/teaching hours and each semester will have $30 \times 15 = 450$ teaching hours available for each student.
 - The odd semester is scheduled from July to December and the even semester from January to June. Each week has a minimum 30 working hours spread over 6 days.
 - Each semester will include - Admission, course work, conduct of examination and declaration of result including semester break.

Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) : CBCS provides choice for students to select from the prescribed Programme.

- An undergraduate programmes leading to the Undergraduate Honours Degree B.Sc. Honours Programme/B.A. Honours Programme/B.Com Honours Programme.

Courses : Each course is designed variously under instruction given as Lectures, Tutorials and Practical (laboratory and field exercises). Usually these components are referred to as *L, T and P* components. The credits for each course determine the volume of the course content.

Courses of a Programme -

- **Ability Enhancement Course (AEC)/Foundation Courses (FC) :** Foundation courses are the courses based upon the content that leads to knowledge enhancement and man-making education.
- **Core Course (CC) :** These courses are to be compulsorily be studied by a student as a core requirement of a Honours programme in a said discipline of the study. It comprises of two courses:
 - Honours Course (HC): These course belong to a subj ect in which student receives degree of Honours.
 - Discipline Specific Elective Core Subjects (DSE): These courses belong to Honours specific elective subjects opted by a student from allowed subject combination along with the Honours Course Subject during V and VI Semester.
- **Generic Elective Subject (GES) :** These courses may be select from the pool of subjects which will be supportive to the student in a discipline of study.
- **Skill Enhancement Course (SEC) :** Will enable exposure to some other discipline/domain, and will nurture students's proficiency/skill.

Choosing programme study courses

At the time of admission each student of B.A./B.Sc./B.Com/Vocational will identify an Honours (140 credits) from the pool of subjects offered by the college.
